

Admission Policy RCOD:

Persons intending to seek admission into Rahbar College of Dentistry, Lahore, must fulfill the following eligibility criteria:

Eligibility Criteria (Local & Foreign Student) Academic Qualifications:

Local students

- Have passed the MDCAT examination
- F.Sc. (Higher Secondary School Certificate HSSC) or an equivalent 12th grade qualification from a foreign university recognized by PM&DC.
- Three science subjects must be included, with Biology and Chemistry being mandatory.
- A minimum aggregate of 60% marks is required (excluding NCC or Hifz-e-Quran marks).
- The third subject can be either Physics or Mathematics.
- Students holding an American High School Diploma or A-• level qualifications must submit an Equivalence Certificate issued by IBCC (Inter Board Committee of Chairmen) along with their application form. The Equivalence Certificate must be submitted at the time of application submission. No Equivalence Certificate will be accepted after the application deadline. A provisional certificate from IBCC is acceptable for the initial submission of the application form. Certificates can be obtained from the following offices of the Inter Board Committee of Chairmen (IBCC). These offices facilitate the issuance of Equivalence Certificates required for students holding American High School Diplomas or A-level qualifications. It is mandatory to submit this certificate at the time of application submission, and no Equivalence Certificate will be accepted after the application deadline.

Admission / Selection Process:

- Application forms with evidence of paid fee, are to be submitted at RCoD admission office.
- The applicants shall be selected on merit for admission in RCoD, as per the above-mentioned weightage criteria.
- 1st Admission merit list shall be displayed on the college website within 15 days of announcement of MDCAT result.
- Admission will be confirmed for selected students only after the payment of college admission, tuition, and other fees within the specified period following the announcement of results by the college.
- Failure to make the complete payment by the due date will result in the seat being offered to the next candidate on the merit list.
- Upon admission, the college will verify Matric, F.Sc, and other certificates with the respective board through UHS.
- If any discrepancies are found in the documents, the admission will be revoked, and fees will not be refunded.
- In cases where multiple students have the same merit position, preference will be given to the older student.
- Hepatitis B vaccination certificate to be rendered by the parents along with attested copy of vaccination card.

Confirmation of Admission:-

Admission of the selected students will be confirmed only after they have deposited the college admission, tuition and other fees as prescribed, within specific days of announcement of the result. If a seat is not confirmed by due date, it will be offered to the next candidate on the merit list.

Once a student is admitted in the college, his Matric, F.Sc, and other certificates will be verified from respective board. If the documents are found incorrect, the admission will be cancelled and the fees/ dues will not be refunded.

In case of students with same merit position, preference will be given to the student who will be older in age.

B: Fee Deposit Policy

- All fee rates mentioned are subject to change without prior notice.
- Specific dates for fee payments are fixed and communicated at the beginning of the academic year through notice boards.
- The college administration does not assume responsibility for reminding parents/guardians about fee payments.
- Students must settle all outstanding dues before they are permitted to appear in university examinations.
- Fine and penalties for late payments are as follows:
 - A fine of Rs. 1000 per day will be imposed if the fee is paid within 31 days after the due date.
 - A fine of Rs. 2000 per day will be imposed if the fee is paid after 31 days following the initial 31-day period.



- If a student fails to pay after 61 days (without valid reason) from the due date, they will be suspended from attending classes until all dues, along with fines, are settled.
- If a student does not pay after 91 days from the due date without written permission, they will be suspended from the college rolls. Re-admission will require payment of the full admission fee.

C: Policy of Students Fee Concession Scholarship Award Policy

- It is mandatory for the institution to grant a 25% waiver on tuition fees to 5% of the enrolled students each academic year.
- This policy is intended to support students who demonstrate exceptional academic performance, financial need, or other qualifying criteria as determined by the institution.
- The fee waiver is applicable for one academic year and may be renewed subject to the student's continued eligibility.
- Recipients must maintain the academic and conduct standards of the institution to retain the fee waiver.
- The fee waiver covers tuition fees only and does not include other expenses such as books, supplies, or living costs.

Scholarship Modalities:

Merit-Based Scholarships (1st & 2nd Position Holders):

Scholarships amounting to Rs 200,000 (Rupees two hundred thousand only) for 1st position holders and Rs 150,000 (Rupees one hundred and fifty thousand only) for 2nd position holders in the annual university exams will be granted upon application by the students. A total of 8 scholarships will be awarded as follows:

• 08 for BDS – 1st to 4th year (2 students per class).



Need-Based Financial Assistance:

Financial assistance of Rs 125,000 (Rupees one hundred and twentyfive thousand only) will be granted to students based on financial need. A total of 3 scholarships will be awarded as follows:

• 03 for BDS – 2nd to 4th year (1 student per class).

Eligibility Criteria:

Unexpected Financial Hardship:

- Sudden loss of family income due to unemployment, disability, or death of the primary wage earner.
- Major medical expenses for the student or immediate family members.
- Natural disasters or other catastrophic events that impact the family's financial stability.
- The family's total annual income, after the occurrence of the financial problem, should not exceed Rs 12,00,000.
- The student must be in good academic standing, maintaining a minimum percentage as specified by the institution's academic policies

Application Review:

All applications of a & b category will be reviewed by a board of officers consisting of the following members:

- o Principal RCoD
- Dy Director Administration
- HOD Dental Education
- Manager Student Affairs
- o Accounts & Finance

Application Submission:

Needy students must submit a written application for need-based financial assistance addressed to the Principal RCoD, along with the



required documents to assess financial background and academic performance.

- Dy Director Administration shall verify he financial status of the applicant.
- HOD Dental Education & Manager Student affairs shall submit a report on the academic status of applicant
- Accounts & Finance shall update on feasibility and scholar ships history of RCoD.
- Principal RCoD shall recommend the application to the Vice Chairman/Chairman for approval.

Refund Policy

- The college adheres to the refund policy established by the PM&DC regarding the reimbursement of admission and tuition fees to students.
- This policy is subject to modification based on directives from PM&DC.

Hostel Fee Policy

- Refundable Hostel Security: 25,000 (PKR)
- Before joining the hostel, all residents are required to deposit a refundable hostel security fee. Amount will be refunded upon clearance.

General rules & regulations:

- Payment of fees is required at the time of admission.
- Local students can pay their fees through a pay order made out to Rahbar College of Dentistry.
- Foreign students must remit the fees in USD through a banking channel from abroad.

Assessment policy

- Each student must appear in the yearly professional exam of all subjects specific for that particular, to qualify for the successive year.
- There is continuous assessment throughout each year through (end of term) block exam, send-ups and professional Exam.
- Assessment procedures are as follows;

Types of Assessment Procedures (Table 1) Formative Assessments:

- Formative assessments, conducted regularly throughout the term, provides feedback to students with the aim of enhancing their learning and improving their performance in summative evaluations.
- It is carried out informally and as required during and after lectures (e.g., 1- minute feedback, class test, problem-based questions, quizzes), tutorials (e.g., question and answer sessions), case-based discussions, written assignments, and class presentations.
- Log books contain rubrics for continuous self-assessment of the practical /clinical sessions, as well as formative assessments.
- Portfolio development is also promoted and assessed as part of the formative evaluation process.
- Reflection is a mandatory part of all laboratories, pre-clinical and clinical exposures
- Regular feedback sessions are held after each block/term examination to aid in improving student performance.



ii. Summative Assessments:

 Conducted as end term exam (Block Exam) carrying 4% weightage to be included in a total of 10% within internal assessment. Each exam shall consist of theory and practical examination.

The division of weightage shall be as follows.

- Written exam consists of MCQs & SEQs, carrying 50% weightage.
- Practical exam consists of OSPE/OSCE and structured viva, carrying 50% weightage.
- Marks of each exam (End term) are included in internal assessment.
- Research carries 1% weightage in internal assessment.
- Send up carries 1% weightage in internal assessment.
- Attendance carries 2% weightage in internal assessment, with equal contribution of (1%) each, of lecture & practical/clinical sessions. Minimum required attendance = 85% = 2% weightage int assessment.
- Generic competencies carry 2% weightage in internal assessment. (Table 2)
- The passing percentage for each exam is 50%.
- Candidates failing to gain passing scores in annual and supplementary exam, shall be detained in the existing year.

iii. Islamic Studies/Civics and Pakistan Studies

- Islamic Studies/Civics and Pakistan Studies will be assessed in first professional examination.
- The paper will carry 100 marks in total. Islamic Studies contains 60 marks and Pakistan Studies carries 40 marks.



- In Islamic studies part, there will be three LEQ to be attempted out of five LEQs, carrying 20 marks each.
- In Pakistan studies part, there will be two LEQ to be attempted out of four LEQs, carrying 20 marks each. Note: Islamic studies is for Muslims and civics is for non-Muslims.

Examination Development and Administration

Development Process

- **Question Pool:** Course head, with teaching faculty, will develop a departmental assessment question pool.
- **Pre exam analysis:** Subject head with their faculty will revise question items with dental education before submitting in a password protected flash drive to department of dental education. Department of dental education shall approve the formatting of reviewed questions, two weeks prior to the assessment date.
- Question paper printing & Answer sheets: Course head will collect the printed papers with answer sheets in sealed envelopes from department of dental education on the day of examination.
- **Conduct of exam:** The seals of papers shall be opened in the examination halls in the presence of candidates and two invigilators. The whole activity shall be monitored.
- Post-Item Analysis: Post-item analysis of MCQs will be done at departmental level using a software. The report will be discussed in a meeting in the department and minuted. Based on the item analysis report and subject in-charge approval, the MCQs will be modified or eliminated from future exams. Also, re-scoring if a significant number of items are problematic.
- **Results Notification**: Results will be notified to the students within two weeks of the examination.
- **Post-Examination Feedback**: Feedback after each assessment will be provide.



Eligibility Criteria.

Attendance:

- Minimum 85% attendance of all educational activities i.e. lectures, SGDs/tutorials, practical/clinicals, official symposia, co-curricular/extra-curricular activities including sports day and community visits.
- Leave is considered an absence unless supported by valid documentation.

Supplementary Students:

- Supplementary students must attend classes of the new academic session for better subject orientation.
- Lecture attendance will be 80%, counted immediately after the supplementary theory exam.

Detained Students

- Must pass all end of term (block exams) and send-up tests and attend planned lectures.
- Detained hostel students' lecture policies may vary with the Principal's permission.

Internal Assessment:

- Pass mark is 50% of total test scores for each subject.
- Send-ups must be passed.





• Academic evaluations will ensure consistent assessment and feedback processes.

Individual Assessment Criteria

- Faculty will review individual assessments regularly to determine student progression.
- The academic coordinator will offer assignments for underperforming students.
- Parent-teacher meetings will be held for underperforming students at designated times.

Feedback

Faculty will provide feedback after each block and at conclusion of an academic year.

- Formative feedback during each preclinical course/module.
- Mandatory feedback for major exams (like end of term) block exams.
- Clinical test feedback at the end of each rotation.
- Students should review assessments by contacting the course director.



Appeal Mechanism for Results

- Students can apply for rechecking of results (block exam) within two working days of the result declaration
- The application will be submitted to the Department of Dental Education and will be approved by the principal RCoD.
- Applications received after that will not be entertained.
- No fees will be charged for rechecking
- The answer sheet will only be shown to the student in the presence of subject head and HoD dental education.
- Response after the appeal of the result rechecking will be declared within one week.
- The rechecking of professional exam will be according to UHS policy.

Quality Control

- Quality Assurance Cell can facilitate the resolution of any issues, contributing to successful outcomes.
- Data from assessments will be leveraged to improve the effectiveness of academic staff, the performance of students, the quality of courses, and the institution's overall operations.
- The Department of Dental Education will carry out frequent evaluations of academic activities and ensure the implementation of this policy by keeping comprehensive records of assessment data.



Transfer and Migration Policy

Rahbar College of Dentistry will proceed to fill seats by migration/transfer from other medical colleges, following the guidelines prescribed by UHS. The University of Health Sciences (UHS) Lahore, invites online applications, as per the prescribed procedure, for migration of MBBS/BDS students enrolled in affiliated Private Sector Medical/Dental institutions under **"Regulations for Migrations of Students 2023"**, notified on 24th January, 2024.

The college-wise detail of vacant seats for the purpose of migration is as follows: PMC National Transfer Policy on vacant seats 2022 and UHS framework for migration. Additionally, RCoD will report dropout students to PM&DC in the first two years in order to maintain the total admission record.

Eligibility Criteria:

 The applicant must be enrolled in a Private Sector Medical/Dental College duly recognized by Pakistan Medical and Dental Council (PM&DC).



- 2. For migration to the Second, Third or Final Year BDS, the student must have passed the BDS First Professional, Second Professional or Third Professional university examination respectively.
- 3. In of inter-university migrations, UHS case Equivalence/Relevance Committee shall determine the equivalence in terms of courses and subjects studied/passed and shall identify the deficient courses and subjects. Migrations shall not be allowed to students having deficient courses and subjects for the said level.
- 4. A student studying in a foreign college/institute may apply for migration to an affiliated private sector medical/dental institution subject to having completed at-least two years of studies and passed the corresponding final examinations for the period of study completed in the foreign college / institute and having qualified the National Equivalence Board (NEB) Exam conducted by the Pakistan Medical & Dental Council (PM&DC). In case a prescribed subject is being taught at the University but not examined in the NEB Examination, UHS shall conduct an examination in the said subject.
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Code of Conduct

All students of Rahbar College of Dentistry are to carefully read the rules and abide by the rules as envisaged in the prospectus, college notification, student guide, and their modifications as and when issued. Violation of these rules is tantamount to breaching college discipline. The case as maybe will be investigated by the designated inquiry committee and forwarded if needed to Disciplinary Committee for further action. The recommendations will be forwarded to the Principal/Dean of RCoD for necessary further action.

General rules:

- a) The students must display their identification cards at all times while on the college premises and hospital.
- b) All students must maintain the decorum of the college through decent and respectable behavior. Students are forbidden to sing, whistle, hoot, create noise, use abusive language, fight and indulge in any unseemly behavior or activity on the college premises at any time.
- c) No student is allowed to loiter and move aimlessly in and around college premises or waste his/ her time in the college cafeteria extensively.



- d) Students have to be present on time, at any specified activity of the college.
- e) Student notices/messages will only be displayed on the notice board placed by the college authorities with the approval of the principal.

Academic Regulations:

Mandatory compliance is expected of the rules and regulations vide- Undertaking given on admission. All fines imposed and disciplinary actions taken will be mentioned on the college leaving certificate.

1. Attendance

The Attendance should be 100% in all interactive lectures / practical / clinical sessions. As per requirements of UHS & PM&DC, a minimum attendance of b5% is MANDATORY "individually" in each subject being taught in that year (in lectures / practicals / clinical sessions), in order to qualify for appearing in UHS annual exam. This will be strictly enforced. The margin of 25% of absence in lectures, practicals, tutorials, demonstrations and clinical wards is desired to cover absence only on account of sickness or any emergency if considered justifiable by the principal. Repeated absence from lectures, practicals, tutorials, demonstrations and hospital clinical wards, without any justified reasons, will make a student liable for punishment.



The students must periodically check their attendance record from concerned department.

For leave of absence, the students must apply in writing and get it countersigned by all HODs before submitting at the principal office. The reasons for his/her request should be clearly mentioned. In all cases, leave taken will be at the student's own risk as far as the percentage of the attendance is concerned; even the medical certificate will not condone for any deficiency in attendance.

2. Academic Performance Assessment

Attaining of 50% marks individually in each subject in Class tests / Block test / Final term / pre-annual examination is MANDATORY. A student can be dropped from appearing in University Exam by the Principal on account of poor academic performance.

Disciplinary Regulations:

- Ragging is strictly prohibited. Anyone found guilty will be imposed a heavy fine and other disciplinary actions including rustication/ expulsion from college/ hostel.
- b) The students should wear a white coat and their I.D tags all the time during academic hours.
- c) Roaming on college premises is prohibited.



d) The appearance and dress code must be by the accepted norms and dignity of the profession. The following are not allowed:

Extreme hairstyles, Revealing clothes, Body and face jewelry (except small ear studs, necklace, and simple ring), Untidy dress, Slippers Track Suite Trousers

- e) Pasting/hanging posters, graffiti, and promotion material of any kind is prohibited.
- f) Any type of political activity, demonstration, protest, or procession is strictly prohibited. Offenders/ abettors will be expelled from college.
- g) No religious ceremony likely to hurt the feelings of other students shall be performed in the college/ hostel
- Any damage whatsoever caused by the student will be recovered/ repaired 'as per actual' from him/ her. A fine may also be imposed.
- All students must provide their and parents' / guardians' correct mailing addresses e.g., phone numbers and emails. Any falsification in this regard will be considered a breach of discipline and any loss to college consequently, will be recovered from the student in addition to fine.
- J) Use of Alcohol and drugs and keeping of arms of all types are strictly prohibited. The offender will be expelled from college.



- Falsification/ abuse of college record/ data shall be considered a serious offense, resulting in strict disciplinary action.
- Any misconduct/ negligence on the part of a student which endangers the life, health, and safety of other students and/ or staff or brings disrepute to the college shall be considered a serious offense and will be punished accordingly.
- Wiolation of morals, such as the use of indecent language, inappropriate remarks, and gestures, abusive quarrelling, fighting, and insolence towards fellow students, faculty, or staff.
- Impersonation of any academic, financial, or otherwise gain shall be considered a serious offense and will be punished accordingly.
- Theft and fraud will bring severe punitive action to the offender.
- p) Any intimidation/ harassment for the reasons of age, gender, race, disability, or religious belief shall result in expulsion from college.
- q) College and Hostel premises are strict 'NO SMOKING' zones. Non-compliance in this regard will result in a fine of Rs.1000/- and a warning. The parents will also be intimated. On the next violation, rustication of students



will result. The third violation will result in expulsion from college.

- Any kind of press conference, interview, writing articles, etc. in media (print and electronic) are strictly prohibited violation shall be seriously punished.
- s) Parking of vehicles of students inside college premises is not allowed.
